Coffee Steams Up JFK

There were those that said it couldn't be Most had lost hope. But then on that miraculous Monday morning after vacation it was standing there. The hot drinks machine had arrived. Outfitted with 25 buttons and the possibility of serving 53 different kinds of beverages, this machine looks pretty serious. The obvious questions are: is the outrageous price of 90 pfennings (1 mark for the cappaccino) worth our money? does the coffee actually contain caffeine? can you put whitener and sugar in the soups? The Muckraker decided to find out. With a test team consisting of a wide range of individuals including males and females, grades 10-13, and coffee drinkers spanning from beginner to addict, The Muckraker put the machine through its paces. The results:

The coffees: The machine offers three types of coffees: normal, mocha, cappuccino. Each one is offered in three potencies: normal, middle, and "strong." Coffee whitener and sugar are also offered in the three potencies and , are free of charge. The best coffee, and in the opinion of most testers the best beverage overall, is the cappuccino. In t h e weaker version it tastes more like chocolate than coffee, meaning that if you are not a coffee addict but the caffeine it is perfect Even t h e stro ver d are advised. It even comes with a little head of

The normal coffee is just that-normal coffee. It scored average marks with the testers without any special remarks. There is a difference between the normal, medium, and strong coffees, albeit not a large one. The normal coffee tasted "pretty watery" with the addict, but he found the strong coffee OK.

None of the testers really knew what a as. Research indicates that it is "a choice variety of coffee, originally coming from Mocha, obtained from a coffee infusion or a combined infusion of chocolate and coffee." OK, whatever, just enjoy it.

The soups: The most interesting part of the hot drinks machine are definitely the soups. First of all, you CANNOT add whitener and suga into your soup no matter how hard you try. We did our best but that machine is just too smart for us. Which is too bad because the whitener and sugar could only improve the tomato soup. Unfortuna tely our editorial policy does not allow us to print exactly what the testers said about the soup except that it looks fluorescent orange with vellow oil patches in it. Let's just say that if someone has a gun at your back and you have to drink a soup, drink the strong one. It's the only one that doesn't taste too much like hot water.
