Personal Notes:

I had the pleasure of meeting the high school music teacher and choir director for grades 5-8, Ms. Cook, as she was leaving to attend a teacher's conference in Hong Kong. Dr. Curtis informed me that the school participates in annual teacher exchanges and that the program profits greatly from these trips. Exciting!

Before the other teachers arrived, I spoke with Dr. Curtis about the wonderful string department at the school. We talked about the well-known benefits of introducing music at an early age. I asked why there was no program for singing/music in the lower grades. Dr. Curtis agreed that this critical piece is missing from the program. I asked why this is so. He replied that School Administration has said due to scheduling, lack of staff, and the existing singing circles, it is not deemed necessary despite Berlin Curriculum requiring it.

Dr. Curtis and I (also a music educator) were in complete agreement that the music department (and other subjects) would benefit greatly from an Early Education Music Specialist being added to the program. I am a big fan of the Music Department and all Dr. Curtis and his colleagues are doing for our school.

As a result of our meeting, I feel Parent Council should address Dr. Curtis' recommendation that music be offered in the early grades.
